City of Vincent Council Proceedings Regular Meeting July 10th, 2023

Mayor Lyn Adson called the regular council meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Roll call showed Heath Miller, John Fransen, Donovan Adson, Brian Mickelson and Michel Fransen present

Public attendees: Daphne Willwerth, Steve Schmalenberger, Craig Larson, Austin Hayek, Marvin Adson

Motion by John Fransen, second by Brian Mickelson to approve the agenda for July 10th, 2023. Heath Miller, John Fransen, Donovan Adson, Brian Mickelson, Michel Fransen present. All ayes, O nays, motion carried.

Water / Sewer Report:

Craig Larson for the month of June 2023: 822.8 thousand gallons were pumped through the tower, 20 thousand gallons were used to flush the iron filters. Still having issues with the High Service Pumps shutting off. The hydrant meter is connected for use by New Coop for the summer season. Flushed some hydrants. Turned on the water at the city park. Got the vent pipe for the furnace at the water plant taken out and have purchased new pipe to install. 0.3941 million gallons were pushed out to the ponds. The depth devices were installed. Pond levels are looking good. The sheep are back at the ponds. The wet wells are looking ok. Will be gone July 23-25 for CEU classes.

Public Comments:

<u>Spraying city alleyways</u>; Mayor Adson rec'vd a complaint that a resident was spraying weeds in an alley that is city property. After discussion, it was decided for residents in town to contact the city so spraying can be contracted out to prevent weed growth in alleyways.

<u>Parking in alleyways</u>; per Marvin's question about parking, in the city code of ordinances a person can park in the alleyway as long as it does not block traffic or abutting property driveway entrances; leaving no less than 10ft for traffic to go by a parked vehicle in the alley.

Wind Turbines:

Austin Hayek presented to council an update on the wind turbine project. He discussed about the setback on townships / towns in Webster County. The maximum distance can be up to 2 miles if your county is not zoned per IA Code. The City of Vincent put in a request to the Webster County Planning and Zoning Dept to amend their current ordinance to 2 miles. The current distance is 1 mile. There are upcoming hearings and meetings for the turbine project. Austin will keep the city in the know when these hearings and meetings are taking place.

Marvin Adson entered the meeting at 6:15 pm. Going back to public comments as Marvin asked about parking in alleyways.

City Ordinances:

Chickens; Mayor Adson has rec'vd concerns and verbal complaints from residents in Vincent in regards to residents having chickens / fowl on their property. The city clerk contacted IA Codification and reached out to other towns for a sample ordinance for chickens / birds within city limits. Upon review of the sample ordinance from the city clerk, discussion was held to either establish a new ordinance, amend

the current ordinance or sent notice to current residents pointing out the current city ordinance. After discussion, council decided for the city clerk to send a letter to the residents that have chickens / fowl on their property making them aware of the current ordinance. No changes were made at this time to the current ordinance for chickens.

Trees; Mayor Adson and the city clerk rec'vd inquiries about planting fruit trees in town. Our current ordinance does not allow fruit trees. After review of the current ordinance and discussion, council decided to amend the ordinance for planting fruit trees. Will hold the public hearing and approve the amended ordinance for planting fruit trees at the August 2023 council meeting.

Mural on City Building:

Councilman Mickelson reached out to the Eagle Grove School art teacher to have a mural painted on one of the city buildings. At this time, the project is put on hold til a later date / time.

City Cameras:

Kyle from Modern Sound Engineering is looking into camera system update options after attending the May meeting and discussing it with council. The estimates were not ready for the July meeting. Will revisit this topic at the August meeting.

Nuisance Abatement:

The city clerk mailed a lawn nuisance letter to the owner of the Vincent Bar.

The city clerk needs to mail a weed nuisance letter to 211 Lawrence St.

105 N 1st St:

Councilman Adson reached out to get pricing on 3/8 minus rock to put around the building. The rock will be delivered when Gary Dencklau gets a chance.

Approve consent agenda:

Streets:

Looking at updating the lights on the snowplow truck. Looking into flag holders for main street. Blacktop Services was contacted to complete streetwork.

Parks:

The parks committee will be installing the flag pole that is behind the water plant building by city hall on the east side. Councilman Fransen picked up the materials from Plastic Recycling out of IA Falls to

repair the picnic tables and this project got completed.

The city clerk contacted Tjaden Electric and they are working on fixing the Veterans' Memorial Lights.

Building Permit Committee:

The city clerk rec'vd permit 011 for review and approval.

Fire Board:

Firemans' Ball will be July 29, 2023. The city clerk contacted TMI services to rent porta potties and there will be no street closure notice during the fireman's ball. Have a fireboard meeting July 12, 2023 at 6 pm.

Community Hall:

There have been rentals.

The city clerk contacted Bianchi Heating & Cooling to fix the heater vent pipe in the kitchen. The hall committee will not move a full rack of tables out of the hall unless the rack is empty as do not want to damage the tables or rack from the weight and they also recommend not having a coat rack in the hall, dismantling the current coat rack and the committee wants to remind that the hall needs to be cleaned the day after the event not 2 days later.

Mayor:

Met with Mark Crimmins regarding the wind farm project, fielded calls, texts and emails regarding the projected wind farm project, rec'vd notification of the landfill rate change for \$1.50/ton increase and forwarded this information on to the city clerk. Fielded a concern for spraying in an alleyway.

Clerk:

Contacted Blacktop Services for approved roadwork estimate, contacted clerknet and IA Codification for sample ordinances for trees, chickens and wind turbines, contacted Modern Sound Engineering for camera estimates, contacted Tjaden Electric to fix a light ballast in city hall and fix the Veteran's Memorial Lights, contacted Smitty's about spraying weeds, mailed a lawn nuisance letter to the bar owner, posted the utility franchise ordinance with Mid American and sent the ppwk to Mid American, submitted our debt report to the State Treasurer and contacted TMI Services for the porta potty rental for the fireman's ball.
